### *The Shadow Box*, Another Square Production

**Review:** What a beautifully and sensitively staged production of "The Shadow Box" by director Robin Henson. The subject of dying was handled with great care by a fine cast on a small stage with simplicity. There were both touching and humorous moments. I would recommend this production as a fine example of amateur theatre at its very best.
