audience reviews

Speech & Debate, Capital Stage

Review: I have already seen this show twice and think it is amazing! All the performers do an excellent job and they should all be proud of their production. I am proud that more and more theater companies in town are taking on subject matters that have previously been off limits. Congratulations to all at Capital Stage, and I encourage everyone to go see this.

Review: Another top class performance from Capitol Stage! I actually saw this show 2 times in 7 days- had to take all my friends the 2nd time! Very funny and very current. THE actors do an amazing job of staying in character as the audience reacts to the lines and action. The characters are very believable and the actors have mastered the 'business' necessary to convey that. I have been to CS shows for the last five years and this one is close to the top. We were actually rooting and hollering at one point in the 2nd act. as always with CS productions, there is plenty to talk about after the show. Thought provoking material is basic stock these days for CS. But no one does it like CS. Very BOLD!

Review: Absolutely loved it! The actors each seemed perfect for their parts. Very, very funny and yet, thought-provoking at the same time. Probably the best play I have seen all year (and I have seen several). The script is great and the actors were fantastic. I may go again.

Review: There is a ton of good theater in town right now (Noises off, I am my own Wife, Atwater: Fixin' to Die) yet this is the show I would choose (in fact am going) to see again. The whole show has a wonderfully sweet, yet nasty feel to it as three teenagers blackmail each other into doing a what ends up being something none of them wanted. Some really amazing performances that will stay with you long after the curtain call. (And can I just say? The character of Dawata is just adorable!)

Review: This play has comedy, drama, singing and dancing, but most of all an interesting and gripping story. Three high school kids (young adults) who don't hang together find common bonds through a possible sex scandal. The three young actors are perfectly cast and perform their roles so well. (Lindsay Carter especially shines as Diwata) This rare script is engrossing and entertaining as you watch it, yet leaves you wanting more. Like many great pieces of art, not all of the questions are answered, leaving the audience much room for thought later. I hope to see it again before it leaves town. Another great Bold play from Capital Stage.
